IF YOU HAVE BEEN AT RISK ASK TO BE TESTED FOR THE VIRUSES

- Even if you have been tested before
- Treatments are available for all three viruses

hepatitis B or HIV?

They are spread through blood or body fluids

- Even an invisible drop of blood can spread infection
- Transmission through sex can also occur, especially for HIV and hepatitis B

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YOU CAN PROTECT YOURSELF AND OTHERS BY:

- Not sharing ANY injecting equipment at all (needles, barrels, filters, spoons, citric or water)
- Always using new clean equipment easily available
- Not sharing toothbrushes or razors
- · Not sharing any piercing or tattoo equipment
- · Always using a condom when you have sex
- GETTING VACCINATED AGAINST HEPATITIS B

You need at least 3 doses and one more after a year. (It does NOT protect you against hepatitis C and HIV)
